Department of Business Management had organized one – day industrial visit to Yarn Division of Surya Lakshmi Cotton Mills for the students of MBA 2nd Year in order to enhance their practical simulation and to have an overview on the activities related to operations and processing of Polyester-Viscose blend carried out in the division located near Amanagal. Mahbubnagar district, Telangana.

The visit was organized with the prior permission from the authorities by Mrs. J. Madhavi took the initiative and made it to be materialized.

Students and faculty coordinators Ms.Meena Alli Assistant Professor, Department of Business Management and Mrs. Radhika , Assistant Professor, Department of Business Management started from the college premises at 9:30 AM.

Students reached the industry at 11:30 A.M. They were welcomed by authorities. Students were split into 3 groups. Mr. Raheem, Quality Department in-charge supported and guided the faculty and students on their visit.

Yarn Division of Surya Lakshmi Cotton Textiles started in the year 1987 and spread over 50 acres of Land with the turnover of 300 to 350 crores and almost 1200 employees. It blends the polyester and viscose to produce the smooth material that can absorb moisture.

Students started the visit with the department of raw material which stores and blend 70% Polyester and 30% Viscose material through Bale Plücker machine. Blended materials stored in an iron box that has the capacity of 1500 kg storage.



Raw Material Procurement

On Rowing machines sensors are used to take care of abrupt halt functioning. Then visited Spinning department and Auto comer department where UV Lamp shed detect defects in cone. Quality Assurance Department where offline checking is done in terms of strength of the final product.

The Manager of the division addressed the students and briefed about the division and its working. He answered various questions posed by the students related to

- Division targets.
- GST affect.
- Profitability.
- Company's turnover.
- Health and Hygiene issues.

We expressed gratitude, to the authorities and had lunch and started back to the college.
